Approximately 45 percent of Ohioans and nearly all (98 percent!) of Geauga County residents rely on groundwater wells to provide a constant supply of clean, safe drinking water. Don't miss this unique opportunity to become "well" educated by learning more about Geauga County's groundwater resources and ways to monitor and maintain your well to safeguard your home's drinking water supply.

Geauga Soil and Water Conservation District, Geauga Public Health, Geauga County Department of Water Resources, and Ohio Environmental Protection Agency are collaborating to present "Well Educated: A Deeper Look at Groundwater and Well Maintenance" on Thursday, March 21 from 6-8 p.m. at the Geauga County Public Library Administrative Center, 12701 Ravenwood Dr., Chardon, OH 44024. Free and open to the public, this program will feature an overview of groundwater in Geauga County, our role in maintaining water wells, the importance of testing, and helpful resources that are available. Don't miss your chance to learn from local resource professionals and take the first important steps toward groundwater protection.

Geauga SWCD is also offering free total coliform bacteria drinking water tests to Geauga County residents who register and attend this program! (Limited quantity, one per household, some restrictions apply.) Reservations are required due to limited seating and the deadline to register is Sunday, March 14. Annual maple sugaring festivities return to Swine Creek Reservation

It's hands-on, educational, inspirational and celebrational – it's Geauga Park District's rich tradition of free maple sugaring events at Swine Creek Reservation in Middlefield, and fun in the park doesn't get much more family-friendly than the annual Sap's-a-Risin' celebration!

Festivities on two more Sundays this season, March 3 and March 10, all from noon to 4 p.m., include sap-gathering in the sugarbush with a horse-drawn sap sled, sugar house tours with sample tastes of fresh syrup, and historical stations with costumed interpreters displaying and demonstrating maple sugaring methods from prehistoric to modern day. Visit Swine Creek Lodge to warm up with free maple treats and live music (Mr. Haney String Band on March 3 and The Real Deal String Band on March 10). Plus, download the free Agents of Discovery app on your mobile device and register your account to play the new Maple Madness Mission, learning lots of fun maple facts all along the way and entering to win a free pint of park-produced maple syrup as a reward just for playing! The 2024 Have A Heart low cost spay/neuter program sponsored by Valley Save-A-Pet will begin on Saturday, March 2. This program offers cat and dog sterilizations at a discounted rate to pet owners.

Volunteers are available to take calls on Monday, Wednesday and the first Saturday of the month between the hours of 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Call (440) 232-2287 (PETS) for more information or to apply for a spay/neuter certificate. Modest additional charges are required for any pet not current on vaccinations and for large dogs whose weight might require additional fees.

With the cooperation of local veterinarians Valley Save-A-Pet has been able to offer this vital service to pet owners for over 47 years. The support of the veterinarians in Cuyahoga, Geauga and Portage Counties has been vital to the success of the Have A Heart program and has helped reduce cat and dog overpopulation in Northeast Ohio. Pet owners and feral cat caregivers are encouraged to take advantage of this program.

BTHS Hosts Program on Shipwreck

Scientist Bob Evans mesmerized an audience of about 50 people with his account of discovering the shipwreck of the SS Central America and recovering two tons of gold coins and bars. The ship had been transporting the gold from the California gold rush, and sank during a hurricane in 1857. Mr. Evans, a native of Columbus, Ohio, was the lead scientist on the expedition during the late 1980's to find the ship which was 170 miles off the Carolina coast and 7,200 feet under water. The program was sponsored by the Bainbridge Twp. Historical Society.




Branch Out with Scholarship to Camp Canopy

Geauga Park District is pleased to offer a turkey hunting opportunity again this spring within its Longo and Farley properties.

For the option to participate, applicants must complete the form located at www. geaugaparkdistrict.org/activity/hunting and email it to permits@geaugaparkdistrict.org or drop it in the mail.

Applications are due March 18 for the youth hunt taking place April 13 and 14, and are due April 1 for the regular hunt taking place April 27 through May 26.

Hunters will be selected by random drawing and notified via email of their acceptance and hunt location. Permits will be sent electronically and include hunt and location information. Details about submitting an application can be found on the form as well. Please note that ODNR rules and regulations apply to all hunting conducted on park property.

"Spring turkey hunting season is approaching soon," Ranger Mike Benesh said. "This is a great opportunity for hunters of all ages to be able to get outside, enjoy the outdoors, and explore some of our undeveloped properties."


